



ABOUT THE SUMMER SCHOOL

The term "diaspora" encompasses a wide range of groups that can be described as "deterritorialized" or "transnational". The relationship between diaspora communities and their respective hosting societies represents a relevant research object connected to a specific demarcation as a constitutive for forming a collective diasporic identity. Such a demarcation, along with solidarity with a country of origin and/or diaspora communities in other hosting societies, does not exclude simultaneous assimilation and loyalty to the current place of residence but rather becomes described as multiple modes of incorporation. The summer school is intended to offer a space to consider the actions of diasporic groups within their hosting societies on social, cultural, economic, and spatial levels. It welcomes participants with diverse disciplinary backgrounds (e. g. from geography, sociology, religious studies, economy) and is open for students, graduates, PhD students and post-docs. Its program consists of lectures, workshops and panel discussions, which we invite you to actively participate in. Participation in the summer school is free of charge. The event is planned as a hybrid format, but on-site participation is encouraged. Travel and accommodation must be organized and financed individually by the participants, costs cannot be covered by the organizers. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis.

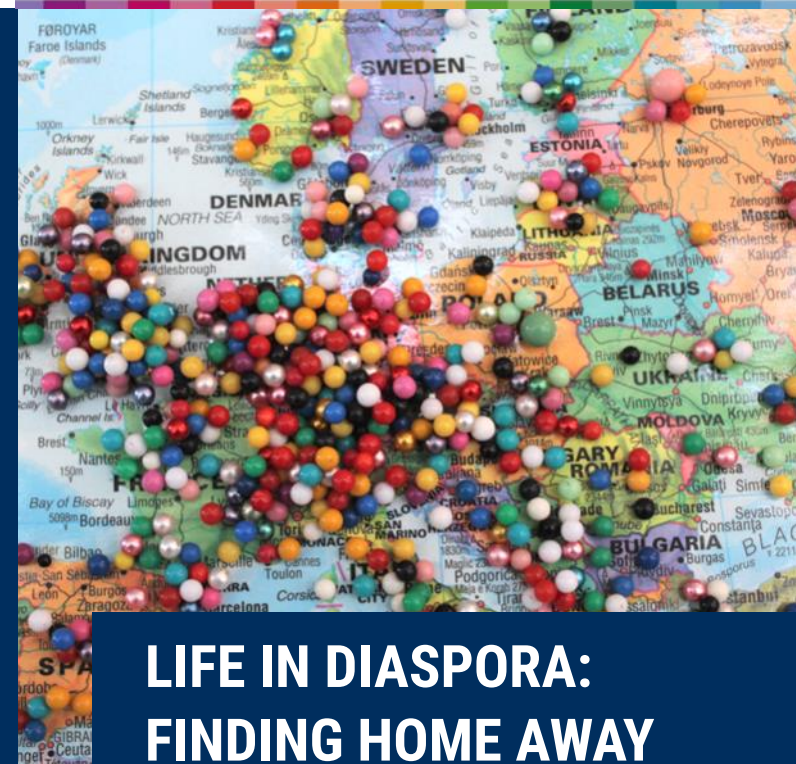
